## **BULK VIDEO SERVICE AGREEMENT**

### **IDENTITY OF THE PARTIES**

This Agreement is entered into by and between **NTS Telephone Company, LLC.**, a Texas Limited Liability Company with its principal offices at 1220 Broadway, Lubbock, Texas, 79401 (NTS) and **Hockley County Sheriff**, with its principal offices at 802 Houston Street, Levelland, Texas 79336 (Customer).

### **INTENT OF THE PARTIES**

NTS is able, through its own network and rights, licenses, contracts and agreements with others to provide Video Service within the city of Levelland, Texas.

NTS' Video Service shall consist of a one-way RF transmission of video programming from NTS' head-end to the Customer's distribution network at a point or points specified in this Agreement (the "Video Service" or "Service"). A list of the channels currently available with NTS' Video Service is attached to this Agreement as **Exhibit A**.

Customer desires to contract with NTS to provide Services to its premises located at **1310 Avenue H, Levelland, TX 79336**.

Furthermore, the parties agree to abide under the terms and conditions set out below.

### **SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF NTS**

Provision of Services. NTS agrees to provide the Services described in **Exhibit A** (the "Services"), attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. NTS agrees that employees of NTS shall perform all work and that NTS shall not subcontract for any Services without prior written consent of Customer which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

Service Standard. NTS agrees that any employees or agents of NTS that assist NTS in the provision of Services shall also satisfy the requirements of this Agreement. In this regard, NTS understands and agrees that all obligations and prohibitions imposed on NTS pursuant to this Agreement are equally applicable to each and every individual providing Services through NTS under this Agreement and NTS shall assure that such individuals agree to comply with such obligations and prohibitions.

### **RESPONSIBILITIES AND COVENANTS OF THE CUSTOMER**

Use of the Service. The Customer shall deliver the Video Services described in **Exhibit A** to the Units identified in **Exhibit B** and shall not display the Video Services in any bar, lounge, hallway, lobby or other common areas of the Premises. The Customer shall ensure that all occupants comply with the terms of NTS' user agreements related to its Video Services which are located at [www.ntscom.com](http://www.ntscom.com).

Non-Interference. Customer represents that it has not granted and will not grant any easement or right which will interfere with the operation of NTS' Services within the Premises.

## RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

Independent Contractor. In the performance of the work, duties and obligations devolving upon it under this Agreement, it is understood and agreed that NTS shall be and at all times is acting and performing as an independent Contractor. Customer shall neither have nor exercise any control or direction over the methods by which NTS shall perform its work and functions; that NTS does, by this Agreement, agree that NTS will perform its work and functions at all times in strict accordance with currently approved methods and practices. The sole interest of Customer is to ensure that Services shall be performed in a competent, efficient and satisfactory manner. No relationship of employer and employee is created by this Agreement and neither NTS nor anyone performing Services for NTS pursuant to this Agreement, whether as an employee, independent contractor, subcontractor or otherwise, shall have any claim under this Agreement or otherwise against Customer for vacation pay, sick leave, retirement benefits, Social Security, Worker's Compensation, disability or unemployment benefits. NTS shall indemnify and hold harmless Customer from any and all liability for fees, compensation, wages and benefits for itself or its staff and from taxes on business income and other costs and expenses of an employer that Customer would incur if, contrary to the parties' intention, NTS or its staff are determined to be employees of Customer.

## TERM OF THE AGREEMENT

Term. The Term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years. The Term shall commence upon initiation of service and shall end thirty-six (36) months thereafter, unless terminated sooner as provided for herein. After the expiration of the original Term of this Agreement, it is automatically renewable on a year-to-year basis, and thereafter terminable on (sixty) 60 days written notice by either party.

Termination for Cause. Customer may terminate this Agreement immediately for cause in the event that NTS (a) files for bankruptcy, is adjudicated bankrupt or has a receiver appointed for substantially all of its assets; (b) has any license or certifications required in order to carry out its duties under this Agreement revoked, suspended or otherwise restricted; or (c) fails to cure a material breach of this Agreement within thirty (30) days after written notice by Customer specifying the nature of such material breach.

Early Termination. If this Agreement is terminated through Customer's default or breach, Customer shall be pay, as penalty, 80% of the remaining monthly recurring charges (MRCs) set out in Exhibit B, through expiration of the original term.

## RATES AND BILLING

Rates NTS shall bill Customer monthly at the rates set out in Exhibit B.

Payment Terms. Customer acknowledges that billings are done on a monthly basis and that payment for services and/or facilities provided pursuant to this Agreement must be received by NTS within thirty (30) days of invoice date. Payments not received within thirty (30) days of any given month's invoice date will result in the right of NTS, with three (3) business days' written notice, to cancel this Agreement and terminate the services and/or facilities provided hereunder. Such right of NTS shall not be exclusive of other remedies available at law or equity for default or breach of this Agreement. Furthermore, Customer's non-payment for any other account or agreement with NTS shall constitute default under this Agreement and entitle NTS to terminate this Agreement as provided above. All amounts which are not paid within thirty (30) days of a given month's invoice date shall accrue interest from invoice date at the rate of eighteen percent (18%) per annum or the highest rate allowed by applicable law, whichever is lower. All amounts which

are due and payable to NTS shall be paid when due notwithstanding any termination of this Agreement.

## PROVISION OF SERVICES

Access. The Customer agrees to allow NTS reasonable access to the Customer's Property for the purpose of installing its facilities, including but not limited to fiber optic cable, copper wire, conduit, Network Interface Devices (NID), power supplies, and related hardware (collectively the Equipment) which NTS deems necessary for the provision of telephone, data or video services to the Customer. Property shall be defined as real property owned, controlled or managed by Customer. Furthermore, Customer agrees to reasonably cooperate and assist NTS in obtaining reasonable access to other property which the Customer does not own or control but access to which NTS deems necessary for providing the Service to Customer.

Installation. The Customer agrees to allow NTS to enter the Customer's Property and to bring its Equipment into the Customer's Equipment Room and connect to an NTS installed NID. Subject to the Customer's consent, which may not be unreasonably withheld, NTS may complete installation by any reasonable means. Reasonable means may include pulling cable through existing conduit, boring underground or through walls for purposes of installing conduit across Customer's Property. The Customer agrees to permit NTS to use any excess, unused, or unoccupied cable, wire or conduit. In the event the Customer does not have an Equipment Room or does not have sufficient space in the Equipment Room, NTS may, at a mutually agreeable location, attach a NID or other Equipment to the exterior of Customer's buildings and connect to Customer's inside wiring. To the extent the Property was in compliance with applicable federal, state, and local codes and standards, e.g., fire codes, electrical codes, safety codes, building codes, elevator codes, JCAHO regulations, NTS agrees to restore the Property to compliance with those codes and standards. The installation of NTS Equipment will not materially alter the aesthetic qualities of the Property.

Power. NTS Equipment shall have access to common power.

Access to NTS Equipment. Acting in coordination with the Customer, NTS shall be permitted reasonable access to the Property at the Customer and NTS mutually agreed upon times to allow NTS to perform maintenance, repair, or removal of the Equipment, so long as access does not interfere with patient care services or areas containing private patient health information.

Ownership of Equipment. Customer acknowledges that all NTS installed Equipment shall remain the property of NTS. The Customer agrees that NTS' Equipment shall be reserved for NTS' exclusive use. Upon expiration or termination of this Agreement, NTS shall have a reasonable period of time to remove its Equipment (excluding installed conduit, cable and wire) from the Property. If NTS leaves any or all of the installed Equipment in place upon expiration or termination, such Equipment shall be deemed to be abandoned by NTS if not removed in a reasonable time and fashion.

Return of the Equipment. The Equipment shall be returned to NTS in good condition reasonable wear and tear excepted. The Customer is solely liable for any damage to the Equipment not directly caused by NTS its agents or contractors up to the full replacement cost.

## MAINTENANCE OF EQUIPMENT

NTS at its expense will maintain its Equipment in a good, workmanlike manner in accordance with all applicable codes, regulations, or laws. Any damage caused to the Premises by NTS during installation, maintenance, repair, or removal of the Equipment will be repaired to Customer's reasonable satisfaction at NTS' expense.

Both NTS and Customer agree to provide, at their respective sites, high quality hardware and software, so as to minimize customer outage. In the event that such outage may occur, the parties agree as follows:

- a. NTS shall have a designated contact person that can be reached twenty-four hours per day who will be available to repair any hardware causing customer outage on the NTS side.
- b. NTS shall endeavor to minimize any outage to a reasonable period of time.
- c. Customer shall be solely responsible for the maintenance of the network beyond the point where NTS connects to the Customer's distribution network.
- d. Customer shall not interfere with, modify, or alter NTS' Service in any way.

## WARRANTY

**OTHER THAN AS EXPRESSLY SET FORTH HEREIN, NTS MAKES NO WARRANTIES, EITHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, AND HEREBY DISCLAIMS ANY WARRANTY OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR USE OR PURPOSE**

## INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION

Insurance. NTS shall, at its own expense, at all times during the term of this Agreement, maintain in full force and effect the following insurance policies in the following amounts: (a) comprehensive commercial general liability insurance with coverage of at least (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$1,000,000) in the annual aggregate; and (b) workers' compensation insurance as required by applicable state law and employers' liability insurance. NTS shall furnish to Customer, upon request, certificates of insurance evidencing that such coverage is in effect and shall notify Customer at least thirty (30) days before any change or cancellation of such coverage.

Indemnification. Each party (the "Indemnifying Party") shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other party and its officers, directors, trustees, and employees from and against any claim, demand, liability, loss, judgment, settlement, suit, action, cost or expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of or incident to the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of the Indemnifying Party, its officers, directors or employees in connection with this Agreement.

## FORCE MAJEURE

If the performance of the respective obligations of either party hereto shall be prevented or interfered with by reason of any fire, flood, epidemic, earthquake, or any other act of God, explosion, fiber cut, strike or other disputes, riot or civil disturbance, war (whether declared or undeclared), armed conflict, any municipal ordinance, or state or federal law, governmental order or regulation, or order of any Court of competent jurisdiction, or other similar forces not within the control of NTS or Customer as the case may be, then NTS and/or Customer, shall not be liable to the other for its failure to perform such obligations hereunder for the limited duration of such force majeure.

## NOTICE

Unless otherwise expressly stated herein, all notices, demands, requests, deliveries, required or permitted by this Agreement shall in writing and be presumed to have been delivered when actually received, or upon the expiration of five (5) days following the date of deposit in a regularly maintained receptacle for first class United States mail, postage fully prepaid, certified or registered, addressed to the addressee at its address set forth below or at such other address as such party may have previously specified by notice delivered in accordance with this paragraph and actually received by the addressee:

## DEFAULT

Upon the occurrence of the following NTS shall have the right, upon ten (10) days prior written notice, to terminate this agreement and cancel all service provided Customer hereunder:

- a. Customer shall generally not pay its debts as they become due or shall admit its inability to pay its debts, or shall make a general assignment for the benefit of creditors; or shall commence any case, proceeding or other action seeking to have an order for relief entered on its behalf as debtor or to adjudicate it a bankrupt or insolvent, or seeking reorganization, arrangement, adjustment, liquidation, dissolution or composition of it or its debts under any law relating to bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization or relief of debtors or seeking appointment of a receiver, trustee, custodian or other similar official for it or for all or any substantial part of its property; or shall take any corporate action to authorize or in contemplation of any of the actions set forth above in this paragraph (a); or
- b. Any case, proceeding or other action shall be commenced seeking to have an order for relief entered against Customer as debtor or to adjudicate it a bankrupt or insolvent, or seeking reorganization, arrangement, adjustment, liquidation, dissolution or composition of it or its debts under any law relating to bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization or relief of debtors, or seeking appointment of a receiver, trustee, custodian or similar official for it or for all or any substantial part of its property, and such case, proceeding or other action (i) results in the entry of an order for relief against it which is not fully stayed within seven (7) business days after the entry thereof or (ii) shall remain undismissed for a period of thirty (30) days.
- c. Customer shall materially breach any provision of this Agreement (excluding any provision for which a separate termination right is specified elsewhere herein) and fail to cure said breach within the ten (10) day notice period referenced above.



## CONFIDENTIALITY

This Agreement shall remain Confidential and shall not be disclosed to any third party without the written consent of the non-disclosing party.

## GENERAL TERMS

Assignment. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns. Customer shall not assign, sublet, delegate, or transfer any of its rights or obligations hereunder without the prior written consent of NTS, said consent not to be unreasonably withheld.

Illegality. If any term or provision of this Agreement shall be found to be illegal or unenforceable, then, notwithstanding such illegality or unenforceability, this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and such term or provision shall be deemed to be deleted. In addition, this Agreement shall be terminated upon the final determination of a governmental entity having jurisdiction over the services provided pursuant to this Agreement that the relationship of the parties and/or services provided hereunder are contrary to existing law.

Duplicate Originals. This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. It shall not be necessary in making proof of this Agreement to produce or account for more than one of such counterparts.

Remedies. Unless expressly stated herein, the remedies provided for in this Agreement are in addition to any other remedies available at law or in equity, by statute, or otherwise.

Attorney's Fees. Should it become necessary for a party hereto to retain the services of an attorney, including in-house counsel, to enforce its rights hereunder, and should any lawsuit or arbitration be necessary to enforce said rights, then the prevailing party shall be entitled to receive its expenses and reasonable attorney's fees from the other party.

Entire Agreement. This Agreement contains the entire agreement and understanding of the parties hereto and supersedes all prior agreements of the parties with respect to the subject matter contained herein.

Amendment. This Agreement shall not be amended, changed, modified, terminated or discharged in whole or in part, except by an instrument in writing duly executed by NTS and Customer, or their respective heirs or assigns.

Headings. The headings included herein are for convenience only and are not intended to, nor do they, constitute a portion of this Agreement and shall not be used in any construction hereof.

Construction. Should an occasion arise in which interpretation of this Agreement becomes necessary, such construction or interpretation shall not presume that the terms hereof be more strictly construed against one party by reason of any rule of construction or authorship.

No Agency Relationship. This Agreement is not intended to be, and shall not be construed to create a partnership, agency, or joint venture between the parties, or result in a joint communications offering to the customers of either NTS or Customer.

Governing Law. This Agreement is executed in Lubbock, Texas and shall in all respects be governed by the laws of the State of Texas, with venue at Lubbock, Texas.

## County Court House and Law Enforcement

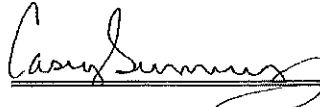

- This bid includes the upgrade of all fixtures in the selected buildings with LED components. This will include the removal of existing fluorescent lamps and ballasts and installing internally driven LED tubes for interior systems. All exterior fixtures will be replaced with NEW LED wall packs, canopies, flood lights, or pole lights. All non-LED exit signs will be replaced with NEW LED exit signs. All emergency ballasts will be removed and replaced with NEW LED emergency lights. A price has been provided to retrofit the existing T5 highbays fixtures in Mallet Arena with LED Tubes as well as an option to replace these fixtures with all NEW solid-state LED highbays.

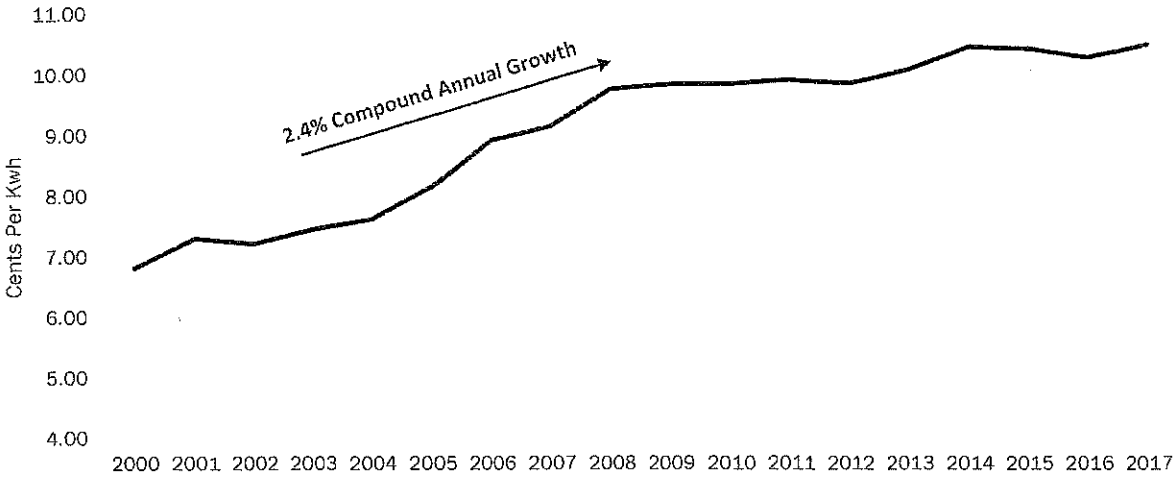

The United States



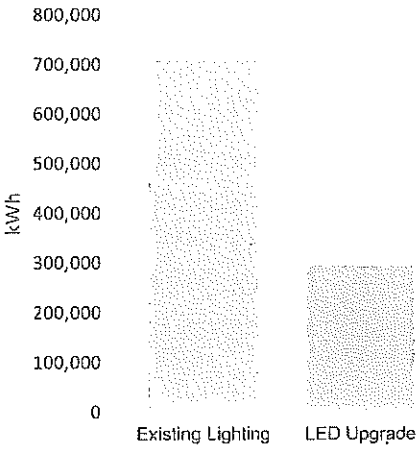

# Executive Summary

Excel is proposing a District-wide energy efficient lighting project designed to generate real dollar savings exceeding the District's payment for the project. This paid from savings project is guaranteed to have ZERO financial risk to the District.

Excel Energy Group, Inc. (Excel), conducted a survey of the Hockley County (District) facilities for the purpose of identifying outdated, inefficient, or deteriorated lighting systems and technology. The survey and subsequent evaluation has led us to recommend and propose the following energy saving upgrades to the District's facilities.

## 1) Lighting Fixture Upgrades

The upgrading and/or replacement of approximately 1,500 lighting fixtures and associated lamps and ballasts. This is an excellent project primarily because many of the lighting products currently in use are so inefficient. Our program provides the District with the best technology in the country and generates a direct reduction in both electric bills and in lamp and ballast maintenance expense. This project is expected to conservatively generate annual savings of \$33,423 at a net cost of \$147,432, with a payback of 4.4 years. A large portion of the project will improve lighting in areas that have inadequate lighting.

## 2) Standardization of Lamps and Ballasts

This project will standardize the lighting products in use across the District's facilities thereby eliminating the need to stock many different lamp and ballast products. Besides spending ZERO dollars in lighting maintenance expense on the fixtures we retrofit for a minimum of three years and virtually no dollars for 6 to 8 years, the District will stock just one major lamp type.

## 3) Total Package Financing

Excel will arrange financing with one of our participating district lenders (or any lender of the District's choosing). The estimated rate for Excel customers desiring 100% financing is 3.50 percent over 6 years. With semi-annual payments of \$13,728 (\$27,456 annually) the payment for the project is actually less than the projected annual savings (by \$5,967), resulting in positive cash flow over the life of the project.

## 4) Guaranteed Savings

Excel guarantees this project will generate enough savings to make the District's payment for the project. In addition to the maintenance savings outlined above, the majority of the District's savings will be generated from lower electric bills. The electric bill savings are calculated simply by measuring the actual wattage consumed by each type of fixture before and after the retrofit. The wattage reduction times annual hours per year times the average cost per kWh for electricity charged by the power company divided by 1,000, equals the savings. (See Guarantee Letter.)

# Guarantee Letter EXHIBIT A

If the Hockley County (District) contracts with Excel Energy Group, Inc. (Excel), to perform energy-efficient lighting upgrades described in the Executive Summary of this proposal, Excel will guarantee the upgrade will achieve enough energy and operational savings to meet the payment for the project according to the following terms and conditions:

## Measure Specific Guarantee of Savings

- The District signs a purchase order with the prices per unit and quantities.
- The "Baseline Year" against which savings are compared shall be the sum of the following for each type of fixture: The pre-retrofit wattage multiplied by the number of fixtures, multiplied by the hours of operation, multiplied by the kWh rate for electricity divided by 1,000.
- The "Measuring Year" shall be the sum of the following for each type of fixture: The post-retrofit wattage multiplied by the number of fixtures, multiplied by the hours of operation, multiplied by the kWh rate for electricity divided by 1,000.
- "Wattage" for each type of fixture is computed by multiplying the measured amperage for each type of fixture times the voltage for each type of fixture.
- The "Total pre-retrofit wattage" for all fixtures is computed by adding the wattage for each existing type of fixture times the quantity of each type of fixture.
- The "Total post-retrofit wattage" for all fixtures is computed by adding the wattage for each new or retrofit type of fixture times the quantity of each type of fixture.
- Annual "Hours of Operation" shall be for interior lighting 2,777 for K-12 w/o Summer, 3,577 for K-12 w/ Summer, College, 3,227 for Office Building, 3,996 for Exterior lighting and 8,760 for all exit signs. Annual hours for areas controlled by occupancy sensors are 70% of the above deemed hours of operation.
- "Rate of Electricity or kWh rate" is the total electric bill divided by the kilowatt-hour usage (\$0.0676).
- Excel will guarantee the DOLLAR savings by the "Measure Specific" method. Excel will measure the pre and post-retrofit amperage in one of each type of fixture. The formula for DOLLAR savings calculations (for each type of fixture) will be: Reduced amps multiplied by voltage, multiplied by the annual hours of operation, multiplied by \$0.0676 per kWh (rate) divided by 1,000, multiplied by the total number of each type of fixture to calculate the total dollar savings for all fixtures.
- It is agreed the District will save at least \$5,451 in material replacement savings per year with our retrofit.

Using the terms above, Excel will guarantee the District the following:

If the District finances for 6 years at 3.50 percent per annum or prevailing rate at time of financing, with semi-annual payments in arrears, the District will save enough dollars using the method described above at the end of the measuring year when compared to the Baseline year, so that the savings when combined with the \$5,451 per year material savings, will equal or exceed the sum of District's semi-annual payments for this upgrade at the end of year one. Excel will reduce the purchase price by any shortfall of computed savings times 6.

- Exit Sign fixtures have a limited warranty by Green Energy Products, Inc. (authorized reseller) for a period of ten years.
- New exterior LED fixtures have a limited warranty by Green Energy Products, Inc. (authorized reseller) for a period of five years.
- LED "screw-in" or "plug-n-play" bulbs have a limited warranty by Green Energy Products, Inc. (authorized reseller) for five years.

In the event of any outage that may occur with any warranted product, Excel will coordinate via Green Energy Products the necessary replacement material. Our program provides the District with a one-quarter percent par stock of lamps and drivers installed. This par stock will be replenished throughout the warranty periods in accordance to Green Energy Products' limited warranty. The District must retain any failed lamps or drivers for collection by Excel.

Upon project completion, the District will sign off on a project completion checklist and approve the installation as satisfactory. After this approval, the District is responsible for any labor necessary for replacing warranted products.

## **PROJECT GUARANTEE**

*Excel is happy to provide portfolio wide financing, based on the results of the measured savings. The length of the repayment will depend on the metered and proven energy savings. The method typically used by Excel, as detailed below, is to calculate an actual baseline and installed usage from metered readings to determine the assumed savings. Excel will meet with the customer to determine the preferred method to use for this project.*

*Excel's typical method is to use the detailed audit performed by our experienced staff of certified auditors and calculate the baseline/installed energy usage. The existing and proposed watt load is found from the product of the fixture quantities and their respective wattages. The hours of operation and energy rate used are agreed on by the customer during the initial project meeting. If the customer requests a specific measurement of their facilities' hours, occupancy loggers can be installed to monitor the hours of occupancy. To obtain adequate data the loggers must be in place for a minimum of one month. Using the watt load and chosen hours, a baseline and proposed energy consumption can be calculated to give the expected energy savings.*

*Before project installation, the project manager (and customer representative) obtains a sample of amperage and voltage meter readings for each major fixture type to verify the actual existing wattages. During these inspections, the manager will also perform light level meter readings to verify the existing foot candles. A similar inspection is performed after the project is complete. To insure continuity of the readings, the same fixtures that were inspected in the existing system are used for the post-readings.*

*The metered wattages allow for a calculation of the actual baseline and installed usage using the hours and energy rate agreed to by the customer. The difference between these two usages will result in the assumed savings.*

*The method for the sample size of fixtures to be metered is determined by the impact of the lamp/fixture on the total project. Each existing and installed product is analyzed to determine if it impacts more than 2% of the total project. As long as it meets that requirement, it is flagged to be metered. A sample size of 10% of each type will be taken to insure adequate data is taken for accurate baseline and post-installation usage.*

*If required, Excel will also track the actual energy usage for an agreed upon time with the customer. Excel staff will monitor the usage from the project to verify the savings. If the metered usage is not in line with the calculated savings (after considering climate conditions and any other variables), then an adjustment to the assumed savings will be made.*

*Excel's guarantee is that the annual savings from the energy efficiency project will meet or exceed the cost of the project. If the annual savings after the measurements and verifications does not meet the guaranteed amount, Excel will reduce the purchase price by any shortfall of computed savings times the payback period.*

## **DISPOSAL**

*Once the installation has been completed, Excel disposes of all removed fixtures, bulbs, ballasts, and wiring in accordance with EPA standards. Many older fixtures contain Polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), which the EPA has deemed an environmental contaminant. As such, Excel sends every removed bulb or ballast containing PCBs to Waste Management's Lamp/Ballast Tracker division at which point in time they dispose of the hazardous materials with EPA certification.
