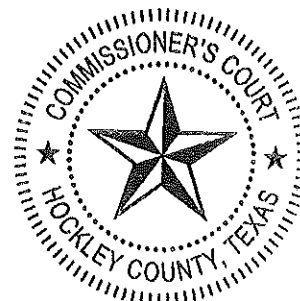

The need for a Drainage Master Plan (DMP) for Hockley County was identified as a Flood Management Evaluation (FME) during the Task 3B Needs Analysis performed for the 2028 Regional Flood Plan. This needs analysis was based on exposure risk, preparedness factors, disaster declarations, and flood insurance claims. The expected benefit of the study is to improve understanding of flooding issues in an area where modeled flood risk is currently very limited and develop alternative solutions to improve flooding issues. FMXs are to be developed in up to six (6) identified flood problem areas.

- 2. Study Map.** See Attachment A, the map showing the study location and delineation of the study watershed. The map should show the hydrologic and hydraulic limits of analysis.

SCOPE OF WORK

All submittals will conform to the content, formatting, and database requirements of Exhibit C Technical Guidelines and Exhibit D Data Submittal Guidelines for Regional Flood Planning from the Regional Flood Planning Group (RFPG) Contract Documents.

Task 1: Project Management and Meetings

- 1) Submit Monthly Detailed Progress Reports following TWDB requirements, including at a minimum:
 - a. Include high level schedule and budget tracking
 - b. Meeting minutes of relevant meetings that occurred during the invoicing period
 - c. Must be submitted within two weeks of month's end
 - d. Summary of Progress Report must accompany each invoice
- 2) Monthly Progress Meetings with Community and TWDB, including a Kick-off and Closeout Meeting.
 - a. An agenda to be provided with a minimum of one day before the meeting.
- 3) Milestone Reporting: Deliverable submissions to TWDB will be required at the following progress milestones:
 - a. 50% (Draft Alternative FMXs Identified) by October 23, 2026
 - b. 90% (Draft Report with BCR and Cost Opinion Information) by February 26, 2027
 - c. 100% (Final Report for inclusion in Regional Flood Plan) by April 26, 2027.
- 4) General project management and communications with Community Staff. Facilitate communication between Community Staff and partner entities.

Task 2: Data Collection and Review

- 1) Efforts to collect data from previous studies performed within the study area must be documented.
 - a. Including, but not limited to, collection of best available data such as existing studies, hydrologic and hydraulic models, GIS data, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Study (FIS) and maps, FEMA Letter of Map Revisions (LOMRs), TWDB Base Level Engineering (BLE) models, master plans, drainage studies and reports, citizen drainage complaint reports, storm damage reports, field survey data, as-built information, other relevant data within the study area, etc.
 - i. Best available GIS data provided by the Community or readily available sources: topographic maps, LIDAR, zoning maps, storm drain system mapping, roadways, property lines, buildings, future land use maps, aerial imagery.
 - ii. System inventory of streams, roadways and other drainage infrastructure to be provided by the County or Communities within the study area.
 - b. When referencing within the report/progress reports, Contractor will cite specific figures/data to ensure that these past reports are being properly incorporated and can be verified by TWDB.
 - c. Data collected will be utilized for modeling efforts. All information from this task will be referenced, cited, and included in the Report deliverable package.

- d. Deliverables must include Data Collection correspondence, reports and studies, and a memo summarizing the data collected.
- 2) Map with areas of concern to be provided by the Community. Additional discussion regarding Community Input is in Task 5 and 6.

Task 3: Survey/Field Work

- 1) As needed, conduct a field visit with Community staff to identify known flood and erosion problems and other areas of concern such as roadway overtopping or structure inundations.
 - a. Maximum of eight (8) hours, not including travel.
- 2) As needed, conduct a field visit to verify topography or existing conditions at areas of concern that will be developed into FMPs.
 - a. Maximum of eight (8) hours, not including travel.

Task 4: Coordination with Applicable Regional Flood Planning Groups and Overlapping Projects

- 1) Coordinate with groups such as General Land Office (GLO), RFPGs, FEMA, and other organizations who may be conducting similar studies within the study area.
 - a. Efforts to seek out overlapping projects and coordination must be documented.
 - b. Duplicate efforts will not be allowed. Any work of this nature will not be compensated as part of this study. Should there be any duplicate study efforts identified, Contractor will immediately contact TWDB to resolve the issue.
 - c. Data must be shared with any surrounding and/or related FIF projects. Data requests from organizations outside of TWDB must be coordinated with TWDB staff and properly documented.
 - d. Communication with applicable RFPGs is required.
 - e. Deliverables must include documentation regarding this coordination.

Task 5: Screening Assessment and Identification of Flood Problems

- 1) Obtain and review Base Level Engineering (BLE) models and data prepared by others to use as a basis for performing high-level planning, screening and analysis. BLE models and data will cover the portions of North Fork Double Mountain Fork Brazos (HUC#12050003), Double Mountain Fork Brazos (HUC#12050004), and Yellow House Draw (HUC#12050001) watersheds within the study area.
- 2) Identify areas of high flood risk to life and property.
 - a. Identify parameters and weighted criteria to determine areas of flood concern to be evaluated in further detail in Task 6.
 - b. Identify what parameters were prioritized to identify flood problem areas, such as structures/ population/ infrastructure in flood hazard area, low water crossings, loss of life/property/etc.
 - c. Identify a list of FMXs for consideration to proceed to Alternatives Analysis.
 - d. Participate with TWDB and Community in selection of FMXs to be considered in Task 7 Alternatives Analysis.
 - e. Gather feedback from communities to validate identified areas of concern
 - i. Get community approval on areas to study in further detail (H&H analysis and Alternative Analysis)
- 3) Develop a preliminary map displaying the BLE rain-on-mesh results (10% and 1%) and initial areas of identified flood risk.

- 4) Deliverables are to include screening assessment models and a detailed section describing the process within the report
 - a. The deliverable is to include the top ten (10) identified areas of flood concern with Community agreement.
 - b. Deliverables must include GIS files and a PDF map of the 1% and 0.2% annual chance flood events.

Task 6: Detailed Hydrologic and Hydraulic (H&H) Analysis

- 5) Identify area of analysis for up to six (6) locations based on the Task 5 output. Areas of further evaluation for FMP development must be approved by the Community.
 - a. Watershed area analyzed is dependent on the area of evaluation determined by the Community.
- 6) Contractor will leverage best available data or develop detailed models to evaluate in up to six (6) areas of interest in detail. Detailed existing conditions will be established.
 - a. The best-available data is to be used for modeling. If existing models exist, Contractor will start the detailed analysis from those models.
 - b. For new model development at the detailed H&H Analysis locations, HEC-HMS v4.8 or newer and HEC-RAS v6.1 or newer is to be used.
 - i. Refined BLE models and data may be leveraged and used for the Detailed H&H Analysis if a 2D modeling software is necessary to evaluate the flood prone area.
 - ii. For riverine evaluations, a 1D HEC-RAS model will be developed and leverage 2D BLE discharges within the 1D analysis.
 - iii. A HEC-HMS model will be developed and leveraged if the upstream drainage area to the evaluation area is less than 5 sq miles.
 - c. National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Atlas 14 or newer rainfall data is to be used.
 - d. A minimum of 10%, 2%, 1%, and 0.2% annual chance flood event must be studied at each of the six (6) project locations.
- 7) Deliverables must include HEC-HMS and HEC-RAS models and a detailed section describing hydrologic analysis results in Report deliverable.
- 8) The deliverables must also include a Flood Problem Areas description memo identifying problems, locations and determination regarding FMX projects selected for Detailed Hydrologic and Hydraulic Analysis and Alternatives Analysis.

Task 7: Alternatives Analysis

- 1) Provide a list of alternative solutions with a brief description of each proposed alternative solution
 - a. Identify up to one (1) alternative analyzed per location (six total locations)
 - b. If additional evaluations were evaluated, document the ones that did not work, so that future studies will not have to duplicate work.
- 2) Report results to describe the results of implementing each of the alternative solutions. Below are maps or tabular data to be included:
 - a. Structures affected by alternative solutions.
 - b. Existing and proposed inundation extents.
 - c. Roadway miles inundated.
 - d. Depth difference grid for the analyzed event.

- e. Highlighted local and watershed wide impacts on a GIS map.
- 3) Produce one-page fact sheets for each solution alternatives
 - a. GIS map of alternative(s) – ensure each alternative is clearly displayed
 - b. Include benefits, costs, assumptions, and constraints
- 4) Identification of water supply benefit, if any, for each alternative recommended.
- 5) Evaluations of flood mitigation projects should be consistent with the latest “Technical Guidelines for Regional Flood Planning,” Exhibit C to Regional Flood Planning Grant Contracts
 - a. Provide a Spreadsheet entry consistent with the latest “Technical Guidelines for Regional Flood Planning,” Exhibit C to Regional Flood Planning Grant Contracts.
 - b. Provide a Geodatabase entry consistent with the latest “Data Submittal Guidelines for Regional Flood Planning,” Exhibit D to Regional Flood Planning Grant Contracts.
 - c. Include FMP and FMS feature classes and appropriate tables for all recommended FMEs based on a Geodatabase entry consistent with the latest “Data Submittal Guidelines for Regional Flood Planning,” Exhibit D to Regional Flood Planning Grant Contracts.
- 6) Each feasible flood mitigation alternative evaluated will identify and compare cost and benefits of projects. Quantification of cost will include engineering, permitting, easement and/or property acquisition, capital cost, operation and maintenance, and other costs as applicable. Quantification of benefit of the project will include the following items, as applicable:
 - a. Number of structures with reduced 100-year (1% annual chance) flood risk.
 - b. Number of structures removed from 100-year (1% annual chance) flood risk.
 - c. Number of structures removed from 500-year (0.2% annual chance) flood risk.
 - d. Residential structures removed from 100-year (1% annual chance) flood risk.
 - e. Estimated Population removed from 100-year (1% annual chance) flood risk.
 - f. Critical facilities removed from 100-year (1% annual chance) flood risk (#).
 - g. Emergency facilities removed 1% annual flood risk (#)
 - h. Number of low water crossings removed from 100-year (1% annual chance) flood risk (#).
 - i. Estimated reduction in road closure occurrences.
 - j. Estimated length of roads removed from 100-year flood risk (miles).
 - k. Estimated farm & ranch land removed from 100-year flood risk (acres).
 - i. Estimated farm & ranch land at 100-year flood risk (acres) should only include farm and ranch land that are negatively impacted by flooding events and should not include land that benefits from floodplains for example rice fields.
 - l. Estimated reduction in fatalities (if available).
 - m. Estimated reduction in injuries (if available).
 - n. Pre-Project Level-of-Service
 - o. Post-Project Level-of-Service
 - p. Cost/structure removed
 - q. Percent Nature-based Solution (by cost)
 - r. Negative Impact (Y/N)
 - s. Negative Impact Mitigation (Y/N).
 - t. Texas F-SVI
 - u. Water Supply Benefit (Y/N)
 - v. Benefit-cost ratio
- 7) Include FMP and FMS One Page Summary for all recommended FMEs and FMSs as described in Task Item 8.d., above.
- 8) The recommended flood risk reduction solutions will have no negative effect on neighboring areas in accordance with statutory requirements for regional flood plans (Texas Water Code § 16.062(i) and (j)(2)). Recommended flood risk reduction solutions, including flood mitigation projects, must meet the definition and requirements regarding no negative effect identified in

Exhibit C to the Regional Flood Planning Contracts, Technical Guidelines for Regional Flood Planning. The flood mitigation projects identified from this FME study must comply with 'no negative effect' in order to be included in the regional flood plans.

- 9) Perform a Benefit-Cost Analysis for all feasible FMP alternatives
 - a. Existing and proposed conditions hydraulic models will be provided
- 10) Deliverables to include a List/Table of Alternative Solutions considered and a list of all Alternative Solutions selected. For the Alternative Solutions selected for analysis, deliverables will include: Maps of Alternative Solutions Results, a One-Pager Fact Sheet for each Alternative Solution analyzed, completed associated Exhibit C Tables (12-14, as applicable), an Exhibit D Geodatabase with completed associated feature classes and/or tables (Tables 12-16, as applicable), a complete No Negative Impact Table, and Benefit-Cost Analysis Calculations.

Task 8: Community Outreach

- 1) Coordinate with cities within the study area for input on data collection. During this time, non-NFIP participants within the County will be given encouragement and guidance on how to adopt floodplain ordinances.
- 2) One (1) public meeting will be held to engage the Community during the study.
 - a. The Public Meeting will occur after the identification of problem areas, identifying feasible FMXs, and after meeting with the sponsoring community.
 - b. The public meeting will inform people of the study, how the study outcome is expected to benefit the community, and to gather any additional study-related information the public may have, including locations of flood risk.
 - c. Contractor will provide hard copy maps for communities to engage and comment on, communicate any identified flood risks in the study area, present the identified FMXs, discuss how the study outcome will benefit the community, and receive feedback.
- 3) Deliverables will include Public Meeting Notices, Public Meeting Sign-In Sheets, Presentation Materials, and Community Feedback Information.

Task 9: Quality Control

- 1) Draft Report must be submitted demonstrating internal QC efforts for this Contract's models.
 - a. QC documentation to include reviewer comments, responses, and confirmation that comments were addressed.
- 2) Report must be submitted demonstrating response to Third Party QA/QC comments for this Contract's models, mapping and geodatabase.
 - a. Documentation to include reviewer comments, responses, and confirmation that comments were addressed.
- 3) Deliverables will include QA/QC reports and documentation regarding the addressed comments.

Task 10: Reporting

- 1) All report submittals will include a succinct executive summary.
 - a. The final report must include a succinct Executive Summary identifying the purpose, methodology, key findings and recommendations of the study
- 2) Draft Report and Final Report will be submitted to TWDB for review via physical hard drive
- 3) Draft and Final Report will be submitted in digital format (.pdf file) to TWDB, RFPG, and Community for review.

- 4) Up to one (1) round of revisions to the report will be performed after receiving feedback from TWDB, RFPG and the Community.
 - a. To maintain the schedule, the Community, TWDB and RFPG will have up to two (2) weeks to review and provide comments.
- 5) All data and tables must follow instructions and templates provided in Exhibits C and D from the Regional Flood Planning Group (RFPG) Contract Documents.
 - a. The Draft and Final reports must meet the requirements of the most recent version of the TWDB report template, as posted on the agency website.
 - b. The Draft and Final reports must meet accessibility requirements, as posted on the agency website.
 - c. The Draft and Final reports must meet all review checklist requirements as posted on TWDB agency website
- 6) The Final report must be submitted via mail after gaining approval from TWDB that the Draft report has been sufficiently updated to satisfy all review requirements.

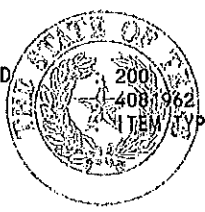

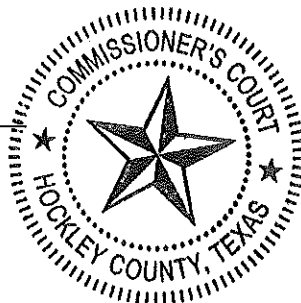
