AMENDMENT TO NON-EXCLUSIVE LICENSE AGREEMENT

This is an amendment ("Amendment") to the Non-Exclusive License Agreement ("NELA") by and between Indigent Healthcare Solutions, Ltd. ("IHS") and Hockley County, Texas ("County"), effective upon execution.

IHS offers to provide, and County desires to obtain, the additional services described in this Amendment, for which the parties agree as follows:

1. MEDICAID ENROLLMENT STATUS SERVICE

- (a) For each Texas Indigent Health Care Act ("Act") client or potential client of County designated by County ("Status Subject"), IHS will determine whether the Status Subject is currently enrolled to receive federal Medicaid assistance ("Medicaid Eligibility Status Services").
- (b) County is responsible for providing information regarding Status Subject ("Status Subject Information") that is necessary for the enrollment status determination; IHS is not responsible for collecting or verifying Status Subject Information, or for the accuracy of the Status Subject Information provided by County. The Status Subject Information provided by County for each Status Subject shall include the information identified in **Attachment A** hereto, and such other information or data as may be necessary or appropriate to the provision of such Service from time to time.
- (c) Based on the Status Subject Information, IHS will determine by inspection of appropriate Medicaid or other third-party records whether Status Subject is enrolled to receive Medicaid assistance, and will report such status to County within 5 business days of a request by County for such determination.
- (d) The fee for the Medicaid Enrollment Status Service shall be 50 cents (\$0.50) per determination per Status Subject. Each distinct determination by IHS of a Status Subject's enrollment status shall be considered a separate status service transaction for billing purposes, whether such distinct determinations are a result of requests made by County at different times; sequential requests made by County because previously provided Subject Information was inaccurate, incomplete or otherwise inadequate to permit an enrollment status determination by IHS; or any other reason not the fault of IHS;
- (e) IHS will invoice County monthly for Medicaid Enrollment Status Services. Payment by County shall be due at IHS's offices at 2040 North Loop 336, Suite 304, Conroe, Texas 77304, no later than thirty (30) days from the date of the invoice. Failure of County timely to remit payment in full may result in suspension or termination by IHS of this service, at IHS's sole option.

2. NO THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARIES

(a) THIS AGREEMENT IS NOT INTENDED TO BE, AND SHALL NOT BE OR BE CONSTRUED TO BE, A THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARY CONTRACT. NO ENROLLMENT SUBJECT IS INTENDED BY EITHER PARTY TO BE, OR SHALL BE, A THIRD-PARTY BENEFICIARY OF THE MEDICAID ENROLLMENT STATUS SERVICE PROVIDED TO COUNTY HEREUNDER

- (b) Both parties recognize and agree that County may financially benefit in the form of saved or avoided financial obligations to persons otherwise qualified to be County Indigent Health Care Act clients if such persons are eligible to receive, and are enrolled and do receive, Medicaid assistance. The services to be provided by IHS to County hereunder are intended to be, and are, solely to assist County with regard to meeting its obligations to provide indigent or other health care to county residents under applicable Texas law, and, where feasible, to conserve limited County financial resources available for such purposes by identifying persons eligible for alternative financial and medical assistance under the Medicaid program.
- (c) IHS's agreement to provide the services hereunder is solely with County and for its benefit, and IHS's sole obligations hereunder are to County. Any benefit, direct or indirect, that may be conferred on or realized by a Status Subject by reason of or resulting from the Enrollment Status Service provided by IHS to County is purely incidental to IHS's performance of services to County hereunder.
- (d) That there are and will be no third-party beneficiaries to this Amendment is a material element of the Amendment, and is a material inducement to IHS to enter into this agreement for services and to provide such services to County, without which IHS would not have agreed to provide such services.

3. TERM; TERMINATION

- (a) This Amendment shall have a term commensurate with the term of the DPSA unless earlier terminated under subsection (b) below; and shall terminate automatically and simultaneously upon termination of the DPSA for any reason, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the parties
- (b) This Amendment may be terminated by either party at any time by giving at least sixty (60) days' written notice to the other; provided, that if any change in relevant law or regulation makes the service unlawful or would subject either party to potential legal liability of any kind, or would impose on either party legal duties or consequences that, in the sole judgment of that party, render the Service undesirable or infeasible, this Agreement may be terminated immediately. Termination by either party shall not, however, relieve County of its obligation to pay for services rendered prior to the termination, and fees accrued.
- (c) If County terminates this Amendment for any reason, any Medicaid Enrollment Status Service begun by IHS for any Status Subjects as of the date termination notice is received by IHS, IHS shall complete determination of the enrollment status of such Status Subjects, and County shall be responsible for the fee for that service for each such Status Subject.
- (d) If IHS terminates this Amendment for any reason,
 - (i) IHS shall complete any Medicaid Enrollment Status Service requests made by County before the date of termination stated in the termination notice, and County shall remain responsible for associated applicable fees; but
 - (ii) IHS shall not be required to accept any additional service requests after the time termination notice is given by IHS.

4. DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTIES

IHS EXPRESSLY DISCLAIMS ANY AND ALL WARRANTIES REGARDING THE MEDICAID ENROLLMENT STATUS SERVICE THAT ARE NOT EXPRESSLY PROVIDED IN THIS AMENDMENT, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ANY IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY OR WARRANTIES OF FITNESS OF USE FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. IHS MAKES NO REPRESENTATIONS REGARDING THE FITNESS FOR USE FOR ANY PURPOSE OF ANY INFORMATION OR DATA PROVIDED TO COUNTY BY IHS IN THE RENDERING OF THE SERVICE. NO ADVICE OR REPRESENTATIONS BY IHS OR IHS PERSONNEL SHALL CREATE ANY SUCH WARRANTY. BECAUSE PERFORMANCE OF THE SERVICE BY IHS DEPENDS ON THIRD-PARTY DATA AND PROCESSES, SUCH AS BUT NOT LIMITED TO U.S. GOVERNMENT DATA AND PROCESSES, AND OTHER THIRD-PARTY ASSISTANCE PROVIDED TO IHS, IHS CANNOT AND DOES NOT MAKE ANY WARRANTY THAT THE SERVICE WILL BE ACCURATE, CURRENT, UNINTERRUPTED OR ERROR-FREE; AND IN PARTICULAR DOES NOT WARRANT THAT ANY INFORMATION OR DATA ACCESSED BY IHS IN THE PROVISION OF THE SERVICES OR PROVIDED BY IHS TO COUNTY THROUGH THE SERVICE WILL BE ACCURATE OR CURRENT.





This letter addresses the Fiscal Year 2021 implementation of the County Assistance Program defined under the rules of TAC Title 43, Part 1, Chapter 29, Subchapter A, Rule § 29.3 (43TAC. § 29.3), the Local Government Assistance Program and the new Rider 19 to the appropriation bill, House Bill number 1 (HB1) which passed the 86th Legislative session.

Transportation Code § 201.706 which passed by the Texas Legislature in 1997, requires the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) to assist counties with materials to repair and maintain county roads damaged by the impact of 2060 Weight Tolerance permits. In addition, the legislation requires that a preference should be made for counties with the most Weight Tolerance permits and a maximum usage should be made of State surplus materials.

To administer this program each county is given a specific allocation to be provided by the respective districts. Allocations are determined based on a county's percent of statewide Weight Tolerance permits, the county's percent of the statewide county road vehicle miles and the county's percent of the statewide lane miles of county roads. TxDOT Districts will notify each county of the assistance available to them. Each county desiring material should make a written request to their TxDOT District Coordinator. TxDOT will also set and account for the value of the materials to insure compliance with state law.

During the recent 86th Legislative Session, Rider 19 was also authorized. Rider 19 allows TxDOT to provide expert advice to cities related to roadway maintenance issues. In addition, if <u>after</u> satisfying the County Assistance Program, State surplus materials are still available, this material may be distributed to either cities or counties. Unlike the County Assistance program, the Local Government Assistance program prohibits the purchase of new materials. Only surplus material will be available for distribution under this program.

Requests for material to be distributed in accordance with House Bill 1 and Rider 19 during fiscal year 2021 should be submitted in writing within 45 days of the date of this letter. The written request should be submitted to: Texas Department of Transportation Attn. David Barrera, 135 Slaton Road, Lubbock, TX 79404-5201. Material allocations not requested by Hockley County within the 45 day timeframe will be made available to other counties. The amount allocated to Hockley County for Fiscal Year 2021 is \$20,730.00.




Should Petitioner remove said pipelines from any of said roads, it will replace and recondition the road concerned, at the location of said removal, in substantially the same condition as it was prior to such removal, all liability of Petitioner for the maintenance and reconditioning of such roads shall cease as soon after such removal as the COUNTY OF HOCKLEY has approved the maintenance and reconditioning work done by Petitioner.
- 5. Petitioner agrees that if at any time the County of Hockley shall deem it necessary to make any improvements or changes on all of or any part of the right of way of the county roads which affect the Utility as located under this order, then and in such event, the Petitioner or his Assignee shall make such reasonable changes of its facilities located within such right of way as may be deemed necessary, such work to be done without cost to Hockley County, Texas.
- 6. The construction or laying of said pipelines by Petitioner hereunder shall be considered and shall constitute and acceptance of this order and of all of the terms and conditions herein set forth.
- 7. Petitioner agrees that if at any time the County of Hockley deems it necessary that these crossings be encased in accordance with the then existing State Highway specifications, Petitioner agrees to do so at its own expense.

We are submitting this bid for earthwork services related to 1.5-miles of Foster Rd improvements, Hockley County, TX.

TASK 1. PRE-GRADING/PROJECT PREPARATION ACTIVITIES

More specifically:

- Install traffic control measures;
 - Traffic Control Contractor shall deliver traffic control items and setup all traffic control items consistent with "Road Closure" criteria;
 - During project, local commercial and residential traffic only will be allowed within the project limits to access their residence or business;
 - Project will be closed to thru traffic;
 - o Traffic control items will be picked up after project is complete;
 - Scope of Work assumes 2-month project duration with one (1) mobilization and one (1) service call;
- Construction staking;
 - Land Surveyor shall survey the edges of the existing road and calculate a road centerline;
 - o Land Surveyor shall stake the centerline and proposed edges of the project;
 - Number of staking points will be determined by the Contractor and only consist of points necessary for Contractor to stay on alignment;
 - o Staking does not include right-of-way boundaries;
- It is our estimation that this task will take approximately 4 to 6 days to complete.

TASK 2. SUBGRADE IMPROVEMENTS

More specifically:

- Grub vegetation from existing road shoulders;
- Reclaim the existing paved surface by utilizing a Rotary Mixer along the 1.5-mile long x 18 ft wide existing paved area;
- Blade the elevation of the road down adequate to yield an approximate 28 ft wide surface:
- Water, process and compact subgrade;
- Import no more than 6,000 cubic yards of crushed caliche base from the Hockley County Precinct 3 Pit;



- Overlay imported caliche base to yield an approximate 8-inch thickness (before compaction) over the 1.5-mile long x 28 ft wide project;
- Water, process and compact subgrade;
- Import approximately 500 cubic yards from the total of 6,000 cubic yards of crushed caliche base from the Hockley County Precinct 3 Pit;
- Overlay the 1,200 linear feet x 28 ft wide segment of road that extends through the existing lake bottom to yield an additional 4-inch thickness (before compaction);
- Overlay existing private driveways within the County Right-of-Way only to yield a 4inch thickness (before compaction);
- Water, process and compact subgrade;
- It is our estimation that this task will take approximately 8 to 10 weeks to complete.

TASK 3. PAVING IMPROVEMENTS

This task consists of the performance of a 2-course penetration over a 1.5-mile long x 24 ft wide project.

More specifically:

- Shoot 0.30 of prime oil on the prepared base;
 - o Allow 48 hours for set up/curing;
 - o The prime oil will be shot to cover 27 feet wide of surface along 1.5-mile of length; The prime oil will be lightly swept for any dust or mud before the 2 course is applied;
- Perform 2-course penetration using approximately 450 cubic yards of seal coat rock;
 - o 2-course (rock) will cover 24 ft wide along 1.5-mile of the roadway;
 - o Each course of rock will be rolled using a pneumatic rubber tire roller;
- Drag broom rock if need be and spot treat if necessary;
- Clean up any excess rock from roadway and dispose as appropriate;
- It is our estimation that this task will take approximately 4 to 6 days to complete.

Only the Scope of Work explicitly described above will be performed for this project. If additional services are required, they can be performed at our then current hourly rates. Exhibits have been included with this proposal for general illustrative purposes only. All boundaries should be considered approximate. Neither the proposal nor the exhibits are intended to be stand-alone documents.


